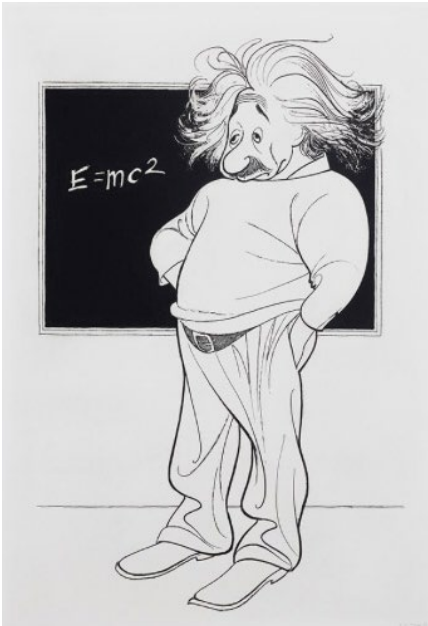

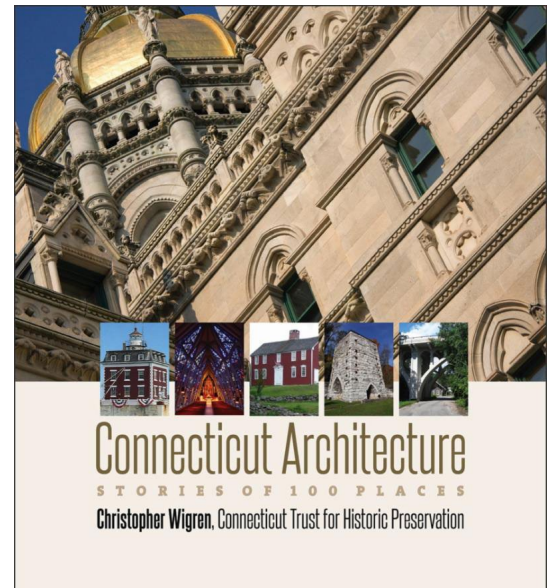

Connecticut Architecture: Stories of 100 Places

**with Christopher Wigren, Deputy Director of
Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation**

Connecticut boasts some of the oldest and most distinctive architecture in New England, from Colonial churches and Modernist houses to refurbished nineteenth-century factories. The state's history includes landscapes of small farmsteads, country churches, urban streets, tobacco sheds, quiet maritime villages, and town greens, as well as more recent suburbs and corporate headquarters. A project of the

Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation, this book reflects more than 30 years of fieldwork and research in state-wide architectural survey and National Register of Historic Places programs. The Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation was established in 1975 to protect and promote buildings, sites, structures, and landscapes that contribute to the heritage and vitality of Connecticut communities.
